Documents required to complete Registration.

Please note that in order to fully register your child at JBS, the following electronic copies are required:

1. **Passport, Emirates ID** copies (student & parents)
2. **Passport Photo** of student (Head and Shoulders)
3. Copy of the **Immunization Record** (student)
4. **Medical Form**
5. Any Educational Psychologist (**Ed Psych report**, if applicable)
6. **End of Term and End of Year school/nursery reports**
7. **Parent Self Declaration Form**
8. **Transfer Certificate** (required for all students)
9. **Ministry of Education Equivalency** for students who have completed Grades 9 & 10 for all students joining from Dubai Schools, non-IB Curriculum.
10. **Student Reference Form**
11. **Undertaking Form** - It is mandatory for all students and parents to provide their Emirates ID (EID) before joining. In case they do not have their EID, an undertaking form needs to be filled by [clicking here](#)



When a child has been admitted to a school in Dubai, he or she must be registered with the KHDA (Knowledge and Human Development Authority).

Students can only attend in the new academic year if they are registered in KHDA's **School system, and the parents have signed the Parents-School Contract.**

IF YOUR CHILD IS TRANSFERRING FROM OVERSEAS, DUBAI OR ANOTHER EMIRATE, then a Transfer Certificate (TC) will be required. Please see details of what is required and whether an attestation is required.

1. TRANSFERRING FROM ANOTHER SCHOOL IN DUBAI.

You must obtain a KHDA Leaving Certificate from your current school to enable us to register your child at JBS with the KHDA.

2. TRANSFERRING - FROM SCHOOLS IN THE UAE OR ANY GCC COUNTRY

- TC is required for all students joining Grade 1 and above.
- This will be an original TC, in the standard UAE format (copy enclosed)
- Typed in English.
- Signed and stamped by the previous school.
- Attested by the Education authority in the Emirate or attested by the Ministry of Education in the GCC Country.

3. TRANSFERRING FROM MIDDLE EAST (EXCLUDING THE UAE / GCC) SOUTH AND CENTRAL AMERICA, ASIA, RUSSIA AND FORMER RUSSIAN STATES, EASTERN EUROPE, AND NEW ZEALAND

TC is required for all students joining Grade 1 and above.

Please have the following.

- Typed in English on the school's original letterhead,
- Showing the school's full name, address, country, and telephone number
- School Principal's Signature and School's Stamp
- Attestation by the Ministry of Education in the country of Origin.
- Attestation by UAE Consulate or Embassy in the origin Country OR by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in UAE

4. TRANSFERRING FROM NORTH AMERICA, WESTERN EUROPE, AND AUSTRALIA

- Typed in English
- Signed and stamped by the previous school

You will have to sign the Parent-School Contract in relation to your child joining Jumeira Baccalaureate School. This can be done online or in-person at the Admissions Office once it's ready.

Term 1 fees – due before 1st August 2026.

There is a sibling discount of 10% on tuition fees for the third (youngest) and subsequent child in each family, paying full fees, for 2026/27 academic years, attending any Taaleem school in Dubai.

We also encourage parents to submit the second and third term fees by post-dated cheques.

Drop off for Early Years and Primary

PreK to KG2 – students must be accompanied to the classroom by an adult.

Grade 1 – Students are dropped off and collected from their classroom's external door.

Grade 2 – Grade 5 are dropped off at the front of the B Building and collected from their homeroom classroom.

Grade 6 – Grade 12 are dropped off at any appropriate gate and make their way to their first class

Arrival

All students should arrive between 7:45–8:00am, Monday to Thursday and 7:35–7:45am every Friday. All students **MUST** be in homeroom by 8:10am, Monday to Thursday and 7:50am on Friday. Students who arrive after this time will be marked as late.

Primary School Hours:

PreK and KG1 – 8:00am to 2:00pm, Monday to Thursday and 7:45am to 11:15am every Friday

KG2 to Grade 5 – 8:00am to 2:50pm, Monday to Thursday 7:35am to 11:25am every Friday

Secondary School Hours:

Grade 6 – Grade 10: 8:00am to 2:50pm, Monday to Thursday and 7:45am to 11:30am every Friday

Grade 11 – Grade 12: 8:00am to 3:30pm, Monday to Thursday and 7:35am to 11:30am every Friday

Admissions/ Accounts office is open: Monday – Thursday 08:00am to 4:00pm, Friday 8:00am– 11:45am.

Punctuality Late Arrivals

Students are expected and required to arrive on time for school. The UAE National Anthem will play at the start of the day and students should be in class at this time. Out of respect for our host country, parents and children are reminded to please stand when the UAE National Anthem is playing. We do understand that late arrivals are occasionally unavoidable. If arriving late (not in class by registration), parents are requested to report to Reception to register their child. Students will not be able to access classes without first visiting Reception and collecting a late slip.

LATE PICKUP It is important that you arrive on time to collect your child at the end of the school day. Staff are not available to supervise children after the school day ends.

Absence

Keeping your child off school for an extended period of time, including sick leave, this requires approval and a Leave of [Absence Form](#) must be filled in and handed to the Primary or Secondary Office, the Head of Primary or the Head of Secondary will make a decision if a leave of absence can be granted. This application should be made **at least two weeks in advance**. The Leave of Absence Form can be downloaded [here](#) or requested from the reception.

Emergency Leave/ Doctor's Appointments

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Doctor/ Dentist Appointments or any other appointments should, where possible, not be arranged during school hours. However, we do understand that this is not always possible and often family emergency situations can occur. In these circumstances, please inform the teacher personally, contact reception and the PA to Head of Primary or PA to Head of Secondary. If the appointment is an emergency, please try to telephone the School and then proceed to Primary or Secondary Office for permission and then to Reception to obtain a leave slip. The Security Team will not allow a child to leave the premises without a signed slip from the school receptionist – email: reception@jbschool.ae

Photo Permissions

Please inform the school in writing if you do not wish for your child to feature in any photography that maybe used in school materials or on External / Social Media. If you do not inform us at the start of the year then we will assume that you have no objection to the photos being used. [Photo Form Enclosed](#)

Security Pass

Everyone entering the campus must sign in with our security and wear a JBS lanyard identity badge. Security usually keeps the Emirates ID of every visitor that enters the JBS campus. [Security Passes](#) are created for the safety and convenience of both students and the family. With this security pass, all family/non-family members (including nannies and drivers) that are mentioned on the form can have badges made to access entrance.

The parent/visitor identity badge MUST be worn at all times whilst on the school campus. Should you not have a visible badge, security or a member of staff will request further information and provide you with a temporary badge.

This Security pass form needs to be filled & then submitted to reception or the admissions' office, the replacement cost is AED 20. [Security Form is enclosed here.](#)

Parent/ Carers Contact

Please note that it is the parent's responsibility to inform [Reception/ Admissions](#) immediately if there are any changes to your contact details – [phone number, email address, home address, emergency contact](#). It is essential that we have accurate contact details in case of an emergency.

If a parent will be travelling and the student will remain in Dubai, please inform the school in writing. Clearly indicate who will have guardianship during this time and provide up to date contact information.

Food and Drink

All students must bring a 1.5 to 2 liters refillable, reusable water bottle to school. We do not allow any glass bottles on campus.

PreK to Grade 1 – should bring their own morning healthy snack and packed lunch into school. They will eat their lunch in their classrooms. Alternatively, we offer a school lunch canteen delivery service for students in these grades. The subscription is placed online through the **Spare App** and is delivered to the students classroom. **Grades 2 –12** – may also bring a packed lunch and morning snack into school if they wish. Alternatively, we offer a school lunch canteen service.

Please note that we have a no nuts, no pork and no fizzy drinks policy at school.

We encourage children to eat healthily.

DON'TS

- Kindly avoid sending in sweets, chocolate, cakes, muffins or crisps/chips.
- Chewing gum is not allowed on campus
- Microwaves are not provided to warm food
- Parents are not allowed to bring food during the school day
- Birthday Celebrations – no food or gift bags are allowed. In Primary a book can be donated to the library on behalf of the celebrating child. (Optional)
- **FOOD DELIVERIES ARE NOT ALLOWED.**

- Meals can be purchased through the Leela's App "Spare" with a prepaid account or termly plan.
- No cash, e-pay, debit or credit cards are accepted at Leela's Lunches
- **Grade 2 to Grade 12** will attend the canteen and pay for school lunches through a Leela's Pre-Paid Card
- If students have lost or forgotten their card, they will go to Primary or Secondary reception to get a food token for that day
- **PreK to Grade 1** students that have signed up to Leela's meal subscription will have school meals delivered to their homeroom
- Allergy accommodations available (e.g. dairy-free, gluten-free).

Students will be required to bring an iPad to school as part of their learning.

To ensure the safest and most effective digital experience for students, we recommend purchasing an iPad through JTRS, who offer exclusive discounted pricing for JBS families and pre-configure devices for school use: <https://jbschool.jtrs.ae> Key features of JTRS devices: Pre-installed school profile to ensure educational-only access. Browsing is filtered and monitored via the school Wi-Fi. Families who already own an iPad can request to have these same safeguarding features applied by contacting JTRS directly.

We are excited to introduce Accelerated Reader for Grades 2–5. This platform provides access to digital books and integrates with our school library, helps track student progress and reading levels more effectively and expands students' choice while ensuring individualised reading support.

JBS SECONDARY BYOD EXPECTATIONS (Grade 6–11)

Students are expected to bring a device that fulfills the following requirements:

- Laptop with a traditional keyboard
- Supported by the most up to date Windows software.
- Installed on the device Microsoft Office 365 package which includes vital apps such as Word, Excel and Powerpoint.
- A screen not smaller than 13 inches.
- A minimum battery life of 6 hours, whereby the device is at full charge on arriving at school.
- A power cable.
- A laptop sleeve to store it in safely

Supporting Independence and Responsibility in the Early Years 13

At Jumeira Baccalaureate School, we believe that developing independence is one of the most important foundations for successful learning. When children are encouraged to take responsibility for themselves, they build confidence, resilience and self-management skills.

Carrying Their Own Belongings

We encourage all children to carry their own school bag, lunch box, water bottle, and folders where appropriate. While it can be tempting to help, carrying their own belongings helps children develop responsibility, organisation, and confidence. As children prepare for Kindergarten, we encourage families to support them in walking into school using their own legs rather than being carried or transported in a stroller. Walking helps children to develop confidence and self-reliance as well as build physical strength and stamina.

Developing Independence in Dressing and Changing

As children enter Kindergarten, they are expected to be developing independence in dressing and changing themselves. These skills are essential for daily school routines, particularly swimming lessons, PE activities, and other occasions where children need to manage their own belongings and clothing.

Children should be able to:

- Put on and take off their shoes independently.
- Manage simple fastenings such as zips and Velcro.
- Change in and out of their swimming clothes with minimal adult support.
- Organise their belongings and return clothing to their bags.
- Attempt to dress themselves after using the toilet.

Encouraging children to complete these tasks themselves at home will help ensure they are well prepared for the expectations of school life.

Toilet Training Expectations

All Kindergarten students from PreK to KG2 must be fully toilet trained before joining school in August.

Being fully toilet trained includes being able to:

- Recognise when they need to use the toilet.
- Use the toilet independently.
- Manage clothing independently.
- Wipe and clean themselves appropriately.
- Flush the toilet.
- Wash and dry their hands independently.

We understand that occasional accidents can happen, particularly during times of excitement, change, or illness. However, children should be able to independently change themselves if an accident occurs. These expectations are important for both children's wellbeing and safeguarding.

School Trips

Backpacks

All students should have the PE bag clearly marked with their name. Bags should not exceed 43cm high x 25cm wide x 20cm deep in order to fit into cubbies and lockers. A robust bag is strongly recommended. They should not be wheeled, as "wheelie bags" are trip hazards and do not fit in the lockers. You will be informed of your child's PE and swimming days during Week 1.

Shoes and Socks

In Primary

Shoes – Black leather / black athletics shoes with no decoration, brand name or colour, which fully support, protects and encloses the foot.

Socks – must be charcoal or black in colour.

In Secondary

Shoes – only leather shoes are allowed; not canvas, cotton etc.

Unacceptable shoes: flip flops, sandals, high heels, spiked shoes and Crocs
